What a Wonderful Wednesday!

As previously mentioned, we hosted two experts from the WalkThrus programme on Wednesday. They were John Tomsett and Andrew Rhodes. They spent the day with us looking at our teaching and learning and also our leadership of this programme. They were incredibly impressed by the work we have done and how teachers are implementing some of the WalkThru strategies; and they were very complimentary about the impact of these strategies on pupil's outcomes in lessons. They saw Early Years teachers and their focus on the number 6, up to Year 6 solving two-step worded problems involving money and writing high quality direct speech - and everything in between! During our staff meeting at the end of the day they shared that out of the 22 schools who have been part of this WalkThru implementation project, Old Fletton has the BEST implementation of any of the schools and has the most embedded practice. They will be returning on the 31st January to look at our implementation of a new strategy called 'Think-Pair-Share'.

Successful Election of a Parent Governor

I am delighted to announce that Phil Hopkins, who has children in Reception and Year 5, was successful in his application to become a Parent Governor. His current role involves expertise in Project Management, which I am sure will be of benefit to the school going forward. It is always wonderful to have expertise outside of education on the Governing Body.

Autism Workshop

Last Tuesday, Mrs Shaw worked with the Local Authority and we hosted an Autism Workshop event for staff from other schools to attend. This was a chance for us all to learn from each other about best practice, whilst recognising that the festive season can bring on additional challenges for pupils with Autism. The feedback from this event has been incredibly positive.

We have been in this role for many years, from the first introduction of iPads through to the emergency online learning (that we would probably all care to forget!). We are in the process of having a full audit of all our resources and are considering how to deploy them better for maximum effect. Once this work has been carried out and we have mapped the National Curriculum and linked Computing to other subjects where possible, we will then turn our focus to putting more fizz into this subject! We are being supported by the Own Trust for day-to-day management of technology and they are also providing expertise in taking our curriculum forward.
