I know that some of you were surprised to receive such specific information about your child's behaviour in class, with regards to the new behaviour policy. We do expect our children to behave in school and follow instructions given by adults, so your support in this is imperative to enable great learning opportunities for all. You will now be contacted when your child receives 3 strikes or more in a day.

Respect - For the environment.

There are new requirements for schools, as well as other large organisations, to improve their recycling systems and consider their impact on the environment. Firstly, we have chosen to tackle our large amounts of food waste. To do this, we will require you to pre order all meals for your children via ParentPay after half-term. This will enable us to be more precise with our ordering of ingredients, which will positively impact both our budget and the amount of food that is wasted.

At the consultation evenings, you were given paper copies of the summer term curriculum for your child. I really appreciate the positive feedback on your increased awareness of what your child will be learning this term.
