and the snowcaps melt.

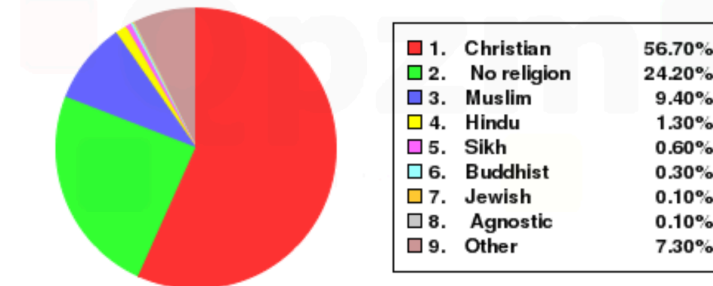
God our Father, show us

The religious make up of Peterborough is 56.7% Christian, 24.2% No religion, 9.4% Muslim, 1.3% Hindu, 0.6% Sikh, 0.3% Buddhist, 0.1% Jewish, 0.1% Agnostic.



12,293 people did not state a religion. 465 people identified as a Jedi Knight and 9 people said they believe in Heavy Metal.

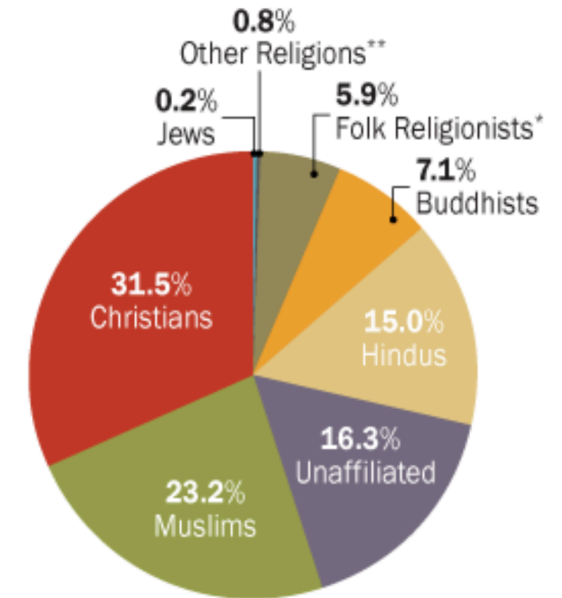
Vocabulary
