Next steps

We are approaching the end of the first nine week cycle and are planning an exciting Week 9 linking to art and being full of creative activities to enhance the children's learning. During this week teachers will be using their assessments from the previous eight weeks to plan for the start of the next cycle.

Due to the change of date for KS2 Sports Day, on Tuesday 11th July all children, except our current Year 6 pupils, will move to their new class for the last two weeks of term. The rationale behind this is not to lose any learning time - we only have 190 school days each year so we need to make the most of them! Also, this will enable a much smoother transition as children will be settled before we break up for the summer holiday. The Year 6 children will continue their transition programme of work but will be based in the reception classrooms for this period.
