What is the lowest temperature recorded

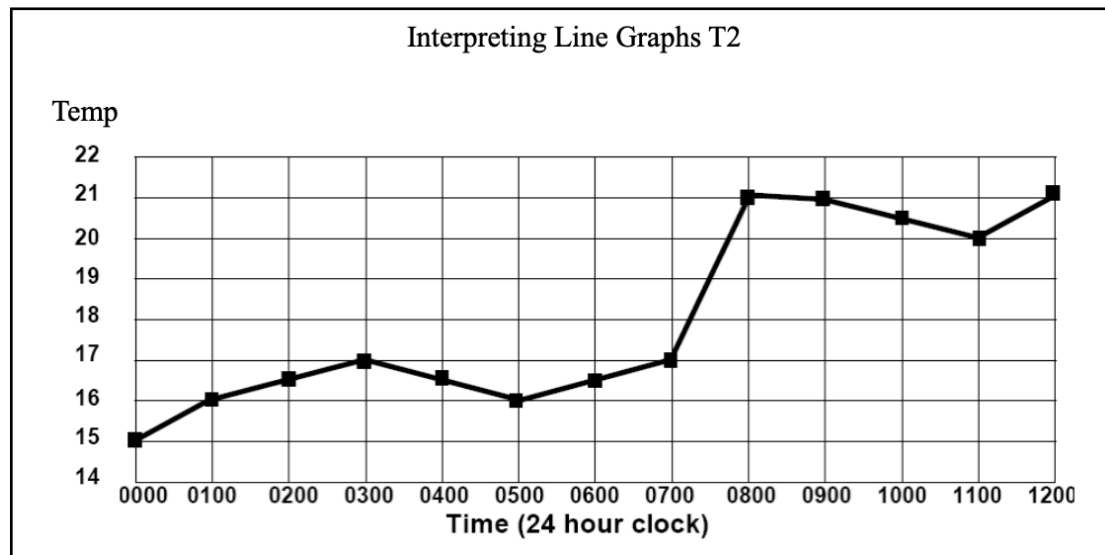
- 21) Look at the line graph to the right. What was the temperature at 3am?

Answers

- 1) Accept any suitable answer e.g. I think that the children were probably feeling really worried that they weren't going to be picked by anyone. They might have also been worried that the person who picked them wasn't going to be very nice.
- 2) Accept any answer which references being excited and surprised because she uses exclamation points at this point in the diary entry and she says 'we can **even** go and help to take care of the animals tomorrow. The word 'even' gives the impression she wasn't expecting to be allowed to.
- 3) Accept a suitable diary entry which follows on from the one provided. e.g. It was very strange when I woke up this morning. At first, I thought that I was at home in London and then I remembered where I really was. George was very teary this morning but he soon cheered up when we went to see the animals. My favourite were the chickens but George preferred the donkey because it's also called George!
- 4) Accept any 5: can, could, may, might, must, shall, should, will, would, ought (as well as negative forms)
