

By the end of this unit we will be able to:

- Know how to count to 20 in French
- Ask someone how they are feeling and respond
- Ask someone their name, age, where they live and reply

Grammar we will learn:

An introduction to 'adjectival agreement' in the simplest form in French. Adding an 'e' to the end of the adjective (in this unit the nationality, English or French) to show that the person talking or being described is female.

Phonics & pronunciation we will see:

- **IN** sound in **cinq**
- **I** sound in **huit, dix, Patrick, habite, Paris & suis**
- **Silent letters: 's'** not pronounced in **appelles, ans, Paris, Londres or habites**
- **Liaison:** When a word that ends in a normally silent consonant is followed by a word starting with a vowel eg **je suis anglaise** pronunciation will change when an 'e' is added to the end of **anglais**
- **Elision** eg **je m'appelle** - drop the 'e', replace with apostrophe and attach to word that follows which begins with vowel or mute 'h'. This is not optional in French.

Skills we will develop:

- To work towards holding a simple conversation with a partner, asking and answering the questions.
- Being able to present ourselves in French.
- Saying what we are called, how old we are, where we live and our nationality.

5. The longest river is La Loire (The Loire).



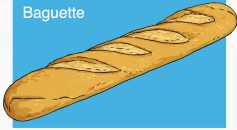
