Ramayana - ancient epic poem

- 2. People read stories for lots of different reasons.
- 3. Most people weren't able to read or write so ancient stories were told to teach people how to live their lives.
- 4. The Ramayana is 24,000 verses long!
- 5. Rama is often painted blue in Hindu paintings.
- 6. In a Hindu wedding the brides wear red.
- 7. The demon Ravana had 10 heads and 20 arms!
- 8. Ravana lived on an island called Lanka.
- 9. Hanuman was a monkey that loved Rama and wanted to help him.

| 3. Epic | A story written as a very long poem |
| 4. Rama | A Hindu prince |
| 5. Sita | Rama's wife |
| 6. Vishnu | A Hindu god |
| 7. Lakshmana | Rama's stepbrother who went with Rama and Sita to the forest as a companion |
| 8. Companion | Someone who spends a lot of time with someone (Lakshmana was a 'travel companion to Rama and Sita) |
| 9. Kingdom | A place ruled by a king |
| 10. Subjects | The people in a kingdom (ruled by a king or queen) |
| 11. Succeed | The person who will take over someone's place or job (king) 'Rama was to succeed King Ayodhya' |
| 12. Entranced | Someone or something that is interesting, keeps your attention because he, she, or it is unusual, exciting, or has a lot of ideas |
| 13. Prosperous | Have lots of money and food to be happy |
| 14. Embodiment | The expression of something in a visible or tangible form (Rama was the embodiment of Vishnu) |
| 15. Decree | An important or 'official' order from a king or queen |
| 16. Banish | To be sent away from a place and not allowed to return |
| 17. Oath | A promise that must not be broken |
