Joseph and his coat of many colours

- 1. Joseph was given a **coat of many colours** by his father.
- 2. His brothers were jealous of him.
- They pretended he had been killed by animals and sent him away to another country.
- Joseph had dreams that predicted the future.



Slaves in Egypt

- The new Pharoah thought the Israelites would outnumber the Egyptians - he decided to enslave all of the Israelites.
- 2. The Israelites were no longer free people.
- They were forced to build huge monuments out of mud and straw in the hot sun!

Moses The Exodus

- 1. Moses' mother did not want him to grow up as a slave.
- 2. She wrapped him in blankets and put him in a basket in the **bulrushes** on the River Nile.
- 3. The Pharoah's daughter, the **princess**, found the baby and raised him in the palace as her son.
- 4. Moses realised he was not an Egyptian but an Israelite.
- 5. He saw how the Israelites were treated and stood up to the Egyptians.
- Moses ran away to hide in exile, got married and lived in Arabia for 40 years.
- 7. A burning bush spoke to Moses.
- 8. God told him he should free the Israelites from slavery.
- He was to deliver God's people out of Egypt to worship on the mountain.

- 1. Moses went to Egypt to free God's people.
- 2. He said 'Let my people go'.
- 3. The Pharaoh did not listen he had a hard heart.
- 4. Moses turned his staff into a snake.
- 5. The Pharaoh did not listen he had a hard heart.
- Moses turned the Nile into red blood and the Egyptians had no water.
- The Pharaoh still did not listen. Moses sent plagues of frogs, flies, killing of animals, painful sores, hailstones that turned into fire, insects that ate the crops and darkness that lasted for 3 days.
- 8. The Pharaoh still did not listen. Moses sent the last plague the worst one of all the **firstborn** of everything in Egypt died, except the Israelites.
- 9. The Israelites then were allowed to leave Egypt.

The Passover

- The Israelites were told by Moses to slaughter a lamb and put its blood on the lintels.
- 2. They were told to bake **unleavened bread** to eat that evening and on their journey to the Promised Land the next day.
- 3. The **Angel of Death** came to kill the firstborn of everything in Egypt: cat, calf, dog and even the Pharoah's son.
- 4. It passed over the Israelites houses as they ate their special **Passover** meal of lamb and bread they were safe.
- 5. Moses told the people of Egypt to remember this special day the **Exodus**.
