The Scouts, the Serpent and the Wilderness

- Saul watched this and saw how popular David
 was
- 10. He tried to kill David but could not.
- 11. Saul then died and his sons wanted to be king.
- 12. David won and became the King of Israel.
- 13. David conquered the city of Jerusalem.
- 14. Jerusalem is called the City of David.

King Soloman

- David wanted to build a home in Jerusalem for the Ark of the Covenant.
- 2. God said David was a man of war and that he wanted a man of peace to build the home for the Ark.
- 3. David murdered a man then married his wife.
- 4. David broke 2 of the laws of the Torah.
- 5. David ruled over the kingdom of Israel for forty years.
- 6. David and Bathsheba had a son called Soloman.
- 7. Soloman became king when David died.
- 8. Soloman married the King of Egypt's daughter.
- 9. He asked God for wisdom and ruled wisely.
- 10. King Soloman built a Holy Temple high on the mount in Jerusalem.
- 11. Yom Kippur is the Day of Atonement when the sins of the Israelites are remembered in the Most Holy Place.
- 12. The priest went into the Most Holy Place and sprinkled blood on the Ark of the Covenant to atone for the sins.
- 13. The Kingdom of Judah was created when King Soloman died and the Kingdom of Israel was divided

Captives in Babylon

- 3. The army Babylon attacked Jerusalem, took the sacred objects from the Temple and set the holy Jewish Temple on fire.
- 4. Important Jews were held in captivity in Babylon.
- 5. When the Persian king attacked Babylon some Jews returned to Jerusalem.

Hannuakah is celebrated as the menorah candle burned with oil for 8 days to rededicate the temple. Some dedicated jews fought against the Greek army.

Esther saved many Jews - she married the king and helped to make him see that evil Haman hated the jews. This is celebrated at the festival of Purim.
